Please help us tell the Toronto District School Board to return our children to their neighbourhood school.



Our children – most of whom are Somali -- have paid a heavy price. They have been cut off from many school activities and are unprotected in a dangerous neighbourhood.

Help us say NO to segregation and the building of an Apartheid school system. Help us stand up for diversity and equality in public education.

On this map, the Queen's Plate buildings are represented as three overlapping circles on Rexdale Blvd. Humberwood Downs JMA is a walk to the west around a park from these buildings (see dotted black line), while Elmbank JMA involves walking north up Highway 27, across Humber College Boulevard and then across Highway 27 and east along Finch Ave. – all very wide and dangerous roads (see solid black line).
